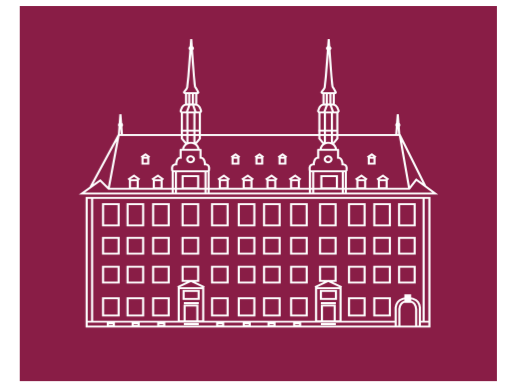

Andrew Walls worked as Professor in Sierra Leone and Nigeria (1957-1965) as well as in Aberdeen and Edinburgh (1970-1997). His work on twentieth century African Christianity has made him one of the most distinguished and reputed scholars in the field.

Roger Bowen is a former missionary who served the Bible Churchmen's Missionary Society (now Crosslinks) in Tanzania from 1965-1980. After his return to England he taught at St. John's College, Nottingham, and worked as General Secretary of Crosslinks.

Brian Stanley is Professor for World Christianity at the Centre for the Study of World Christianity, Edinburgh.
