IEG RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME

The Leibniz Institute of European History awards research fellowships to current PhD students and postdocs. Grants are available for projects in the religious, political, social and cultural history of Europe between approx. 1450 and 1970. Projects in a transnational and comparative questions or addressing questions of transfer are particularly encouraged, as are topics in intellectual, church and theological history.

Doctoral Research Fellowships

The IEG's doctoral research fellowships give PhD candidates the opportunity to concentrate on their own dissertation project. Fellows live and work at the Institute and are advised by a mentor from among the IEG's academic staff.
